• In the academic 2021-2022 spring semester, the Elective Education Center provided education to a total of 3567 students who chose 59 courses from different categories according to their wishes and interests.


Course Selection

Midterm Exam: At least one midterm exam is given for each course in each semester. Mid-term evaluations of projects, graduation papers, laboratories, workshops and similar studies can replace midterm exams. Midterm exam results are announced before the general exam period.

- a) General Exam: The course's general exam is held at the end of the semester or year in which that course is completed. Students who register for the course and fulfill the attendance requirement take the general exam. With the decisions of the relevant boards, a threshold grade can be placed for the general exam.
- b) Make-up exam: It is an exam taken by waiving the general exam grade optionally to raise the grade, although the exams held at the end of the semester/year are successful with the failed courses. A student who wants to take the exam to raise the grade can only take the make-up exam for one course and must apply to the relevant unit with a petition at least one week before the exam for that course.

- d) Excuse exam: is an exam held instead of midterm and make-up exams. Although they have the right to take these exams; students who could not take the exam due to their reasonable and valid excuses, those whose excuses were accepted by the relevant administrative boards, have the right to take the exam within the same semester according to the calendar determined by the relevant board of directors. For the excuse exam application, the student must apply to the secretariat of the Faculty/ Directorate where registered.
- Our university's "Exam Commission determines the exam date and time".
- In case of two courses exams conflict, the student may request an excuse exam. The excuse for the General Exam is the makeup exam.
